REEF Festival launches its 5th Edition featuring a program of new collaborations and unprecedented Activities Kobayat from August 31 to September 4 Hermel from September 8 to September 10

Since its inception in 2019, the REEF Festival (Rural Encounters on Environment and films) has carved out a distinctive path in the Arab world, centering around the essence of natural heritage, cinema, and rural culture. Originating in Kobayat, Akkar, the festival's resounding success prompted its expansion to other regions of Lebanon. Following triumphant editions in Bisri Valley, Rashaya-Kfarmishki, and Hamana, REEF's organizing associations - the Akkar Council of Environment and Aflamuna (previously known as Beirut DC) - now unveil two new events this summer in Kobayat from August 31 to September 4 and in Hermel from September 8 to September 10.

In 2023, a central theme revolves around transformations

At the heart of REEF lies the organizers' commitment to provide disadvantaged and remote rural regions with direct access to culture and spaces for exchanging ideas about the preservation of their natural heritage. In the context of the ongoing socio-economic crisis, the renewal of this festival, which has been well-received by the local residents, demonstrates the desire to maintain a space for escapism, gathering, and reflection on issues related to the common good.

Ever attentive to the difficulties faced by the country, the organizers of REEF have chosen to approach the 2023 edition from the perspective of transformations including geological changes, climate change, water pollution, deforestation, and migrations of animal species, leading to social, demographic, and cultural shifts. REEF 2023 will not only address the negative consequences of these endured transformations but also explore the alternatives and solutions arising from them: new sustainable lifestyles, consumption patterns, and movements of solidarity and cohesion. This overarching theme will be woven throughout various creative workshops, conferences, films, and field visits, involving experts, local stakeholders, and residents, with the aim of stimulating reflection and generating proposals.

Each year, a mascot is chosen to raise awareness among the inhabitants about the importance of protecting the fauna of their region. REEF 2023 will be symbolized by the turtle, thus alerting to the significance of safeguarding this species decimated by the devastating fires of 2021 and 2022.

EVENTS AROUND CINEMA AND PERFORMING ARTS

Lebanon's First Screening of Arab and International Films

Addressing the theme of the 2023 edition from various perspectives, the films selected for the festival will almost all be publicly screened for the first time in Lebanon. Several of them have been chosen by international festivals and received awards. After the screenings, there will be discussions with the audience in the presence of film experts.

Short and Medium-Length Film Competition

Two prizes will be awarded to 11 Arab short films in competition by a jury of professionals consisting of actress Nada Bou Farhat, director Hady Zaccak, and visual effects and post-producer, expert Mahmoud Korek. As a non-professional jury, the "Young REEF Ambassadors" will present an award for their favorite medium-length film from a selection of 5 international productions. The films in competition will be screened during the festival before the announcement of the results at the Silk Factory of Kobayat and on aflamuna.online, the platform where a "public award" will be presented to the winner when the voting closes.

Workshops and Screenings of "Correspondences between Women" and "Animation Films"

The festival audience will discover mini-films made by women from Akkar during a "1 Minute for a Film" workshop organized by Egyptian filmmaker Amal Ramsis before the festival, as well as animated films produced by youths from Hermel aged 13 to 18 under the guidance of Fadi Syriani, founder of the Youth Animation Platform.

Musical Parade and Performing Arts

Thanks to the new partnership with the Collectif Kahraba, the public will experience artistic performances and the animation of the clown "Vol Terre" in the streets of the city. A parade through the city streets will be organized by the Lami Conservatory to inaugurate the festival.



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• NATURE, ECOLOGY AND RURAL ACTIVITIES

Hiking along Three Themed Trails

- > An itinerary following the water sources path around Kobayat;
- > A route exploring geological transformations led by expert Dr. Atta Elias;
- > An "Art Trail" offered by Hamana Artist House in the Kobayat forest, featuring "artistic stations."

These easily accessible hikes will be accompanied by educational presentations.

Conferences organized through new collaborations on the following themes:

A plastics recycling workshop led by REEF's partner, Cedar Environmental, under the guidance of engineer Ziad Abi Chaker.

A fashion parade titled "Rouh," organized by Rytta Couture, featuring "upcycled" garments made from reclaimed and reused fabrics.

The Silk Factory of Kobayat, a remarkable historical monument from the 18th century, will host most of the activities, which are free and open to the public without prior registration, except for the hikes and some specific animations (practical information can be found at the end of this release).

Additionally, visitors can explore the local products market at the Silk Factory of Kobayat, where regional culinary specialties, preserves, and artisanal creations will be available for purchase.

REEF's Young Ambassadors

Among the novelties of this edition, REEF's Young Ambassadors are a group of around twenty volunteers from Akkar, aged between 13 and 18 years old. Their mission will be to follow the festival from start to finish, conduct interviews with invited experts and professionals, moderate certain exchange sessions, and present an award as part of the mid-length film competition. Under the guidance of active members of the REEF team, they will also receive awareness sessions on environmental issues.



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HIGHLIGHTS OF REEF HERMEL (September 8-10)

The extension of the festival to the Bekaa region in partnership with the Cultural Association of Hermel (Mountada Al Tourath wal Thaqafa) aims to strengthen the ties between two neighboring regions, united by common challenges related to their environment. The Oronte River (El-Assi) will be at the heart of these encounters. Once a popular local leisure and tourism site, the Oronte has been severely polluted due to long-term overexploitation. The highlights of the festival in Hermel will include:

- Morning hike and rafting sessions on the Oronte and in the heights of Hermel in the "jird," providing an opportunity to explore the natural treasures and the hazards threatening them.
- Screenings of Arab and international films,
- One-minute films created by the women of Hermel and animations films by Hermel's teenagers,
- Conferences on the challenges of preserving the Oronte, featuring various experts from Hermel who will present the challenges and solutions to safeguard this vital resource, along with a conference on food sovereignty.
- A concert with the artist and oud player Hussein Khalil and talents from Hermel
- A workshop for the younger participants.

These events will take place at the premises of the Cultural Association of Hermel and at the Maison de l'Oronte.



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Interview with

Antoine Daher, President of the Council of environment, & Eliane Raheb, Artistic Director of the Festival and member of Aflamuna

Question: On its fifth anniversary, REEF reflects on the transformation of the natural environment. How has the festival itself undergone a profound metamorphosis throughout the years?

Eliane Raheb: Contemplating the five-year journey of REEF is akin to delving into a profound dream that transcended reality, embracing genuine metamorphosis and surmounting numerous challenges. From an unprecedented two-day cinematic experiment interwoven with nature, we meticulously shaped REEF into a festival that now beckons over 4000 enthusiasts for five enchanting days. Year after year, we nurtured this event, molding it in the light of our aspirations, the cultural yearnings of the region, the pressing issues to address, and the experiences we longed to delve into. We traversed the realms of environment and its impact on modern life, the safeguarding of Akkar and Lebanon's pristine landscapes, the disruptive influence of the pandemic on our existence, the unresolved waste crisis, the devastating forest fires ravaging Lebanon's natural beauty, and the exceptional splendor of Kobayat's woodland and its environs. Cinema served as a potent medium, magnetizing the public and drawing them into the realms of rural life and ecology.

Antoine Daher: By no means an exaggeration, the REEF festival has, over the past half-decade, orchestrated a profound metamorphosis in the cultural and festive tapestry of Kobayat and Akkar. It has gracefully bestowed upon us an eagerly anticipated gathering. In the past, September signified a decline in both cultural and economic vibrancy in our region, with festivities typically culminating around August 15th and the Feast of the Assumption. Now, the initial days of September unfurl a second summer adorned with ecological hues, cinematic enchantment, harmonies of music, environmental consciousness, rural charms, indigenous gastronomy, and the camaraderie of long-forgotten markets. The northern reaches of Lebanon, once perceived on the periphery of innovative events that solely unfolded in the country's central part, now beckon a novel community of cinephiles, filmmakers, and artists, enticed by a magnetic amalgamation of open-air cinema, wilderness explorations, eco-advocacy, and environmental causes. Above all, they come to discover the untamed allure of Akkar and its vast reservoirs of natural, human, and culinary potential. The profusion of workshops preceding the festival empowers a youth fervent for cultural exposure, forging connections with diverse artistic expressions, thereby opening new horizons for those hitherto bereft of such transformative initiations.



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Q: What were the challenges you had to overcome for REEF to continue to exist five years later?

E.R. - The initial hurdle lay in reintroducing cinema to this region after its prolonged absence. Our vision was to reinstate a sense of pride in the "provincial" identity, showcasing the richness of rural narratives. Additionally, we confronted the challenges stemming from the past three years of crisis, finding solutions to address basic service issues like electricity, fuel, and transportation for our team, audience, and guests. "REEF malgré tout" (REEF despite everything) became our rallying cry in 2021, a year marred by various misfortunes, including the devastating forest fires in Kobayat, the explosion in Tleil, and the relentless fuel shortage.

Antoine Daher - At every moment of contemplating giving up, the local community extended its support, reinforcing our commitment. The profound attachment of people to these culturally significant endeavors bolstered our determination. In the face of the socio-economic turmoil, the environment and culture emerged as the final bastions of resistance."

Q: How does the local populace transcend their role as mere observers and actively engage in this event's essence?

E.R. - At its core, we conduct enlightening workshops on environmental issues for both young minds and adults, encompassing crucial topics like sorting, composting, and recycling. Furthermore, each edition witnesses specialized workshops catering to diverse segments of our audience. The youth delve into short film production, teenagers explore the realm of animation film creation, and we cannot help but marvel at the unyielding spirit and zeal of the women from Akkar, who produce one-minute films. Their unwavering determination and fervor leave us inspired. Not only that, these women hailing from rural regions enchant us with their culinary expertise, profound knowledge of the land, and deft artisanal skills, which epitomize an authentic "cultural heritage." This very reason has led us to dedicate a marketplace exclusively to local products, paying homage to these remarkable individuals for three consecutive years."

Q: How do film programming and audiovisual creation workshops find their manifestation?

E.R. - The screening of more than 90 films from diverse corners of the world at REEF has been enabled by the collaboration of Aflamuna and supportive partners, who graciously contribute to the financing of screening rights. The ardent passion of the public for cinema has further motivated us to establish a monthly film club in Kobayat since 2021, extending beyond the confines of REEF. In the realm of audiovisual creation workshops, the expertise of seasoned professionals guides the participants, offering them unparalleled support and appreciation for their endeavors. In welcoming expert guests, we witness the delight of their experiences, which not only unveils hidden talents in



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remote regions of Lebanon but also allows them to explore an extraordinary natural heritage often obscured or unfamiliar.

Q: How do you perceive the impacts of REEF on the Akkar region, particularly in terms of its transformative effect on the region's image, tourism, and economic dynamics?

A.D.- The metamorphosis of the region's image, once perceived as a distant and unattractive corner, to a favored destination among both local and foreign residents in Lebanon, bears witness to the profound influence of REEF. Its positive influence on tourism is evident not only to the region's inhabitants but also to the stakeholders in the tourism sector. Kobayat and its environs thrive during the festival and the preceding week, with a surge in chalets, hotels, guest-houses, transportation services, eateries, shops, artisans, and souvenir vendors, as well as increased activity in the souk, participation from festival members, technicians, mountain guides, and more. This spectacle of "full occupancy" exemplifies how REEF has not only integrated itself into the region's local economy and has become an integral part of its cultural and environmental heritage.

Q: Amidst a nation facing unprecedented fragility and uncertainty, could one argue that this festival's significance pales in comparison?

A.D. - The ecological inquiry is occasionally misconstrued as a privilege, reserved for the affluent who can afford to prioritize it. In rural areas, our challenge lies in demonstrating that preserving and cherishing our heritage contributes to an enhanced quality of life, and even an improved standard of living. Our mission is to enlighten our audiences about the detrimental consequences of a degraded environment. For instance, pollution adversely impacts the health of the population, with limited access to proper medical care. Moreover, the exceptional natural heritage of regions like Akkar presents opportunities for ecological and responsible tourism, fostering employment opportunities and economic advantages.



The lecture includes examples of observations and signs of these transformations and their imprints on nature and landscapes. Afterwards, from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM, there will be a field trip with Dr. Elias to explore the geological transformations on the ground in the highlands of the mountainous region, walking through Karm Shbat and along the Lemon Fault Line that divides the region into two large plates: the African plate moving in one direction and the Arabian plate moving in the opposite direction, leading to significant changes.




Clown "Vol Terre" with Collectif Kahraba
